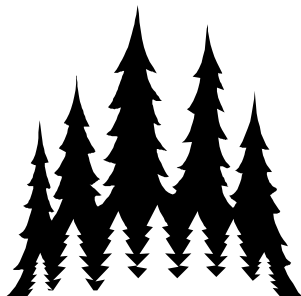

LEHIGH COUNTY CONSERVATION DISTRICT 2009 TREE SEEDLING SALE

The Lehigh County Conservation District is again holding its annual tree seedling sale to offer landowners, homeowners, and other individuals the opportunity to improve and protect the environment while beautifying and increasing the value of their property. Proceeds of the sale are used to fund educational programs conducted by the Lehigh County Conservation District. The variety of tree seedlings and seeds being offered was selected to provide a wide variety of uses, and can be grown under a variety of conditions. All tree seedlings are bare root seedlings. Please note that while the District makes every effort to ensure tree health, we do not offer any guarantees.

Douglas Fir (*Pseudotsuga menziesii glauca*): 3 years old. 10"-20". Winter hardy, good ornamental. Most popular Christmas tree. Soft, short green needles. Grows fastest in fertile, well-drained soil. Do not plant in frost pockets. Grows 6 feet in 7 to 8 years. Can attain heights to 100 feet. **25 seedlings per bundle.**

Norway Spruce (*Picea abies*): 3 years old. 8"-18". Short green needles, more rapid growth than Blue Spruce. Excellent for ornamental, screens, windbreaks and Christmas trees. Can attain a height of 100 feet. Does well in most soil. **25 seedlings per bundle.**

Colorado Blue Spruce (*Picea pungens*): 3 years old. 6"-12". Short, stiff silver-blue to bluish green needles. Slow grower. One of the finest trees for ornamental purposes. Likes ordinary soil and average moisture with full sun. Heights to 40 feet. **25 seedlings per bundle.**

Concolor Fir (*Abies concolor*): 2 years old. 5"-10". Evergreen. 30 to 50 feet in height by 15 to 30 feet in spread with 1 1/2" needles. Can reach 100 feet. Slow to medium growth rate. Can tolerate heat, drought and poor soils except heavy clay. Popular Christmas tree species. **25 seedlings per bundle.**

Eastern White Pine (*Pinus strobus*): 4 years old. 10"-22". Soft bluish-green needles, 3 to 5 inches. Grows well in most average to moist soils. Excellent ornamental if sheared light. Also good windbreak and timber species. Can grow more than 100 feet in height. **25 seedlings per bundle.**

Fraser Fir (*Abies fraseri*): 3 years old. 5"-10". A beautiful evergreen with stout rounded needles which are dark shiny green above and silvery banded below. Has excellent needle retention and is often used as a Christmas tree or ornamental. Can reach heights of 30 to 50 feet. Prefers moist soils and is very shade tolerant. **25 seedlings per bundle.**

American (Eastern) Arborvitae (*Thuja occidentalis*): 4 years old. 12"-24". Prefers a semi-moist site: deep moist loam in well drained soil but will tolerate sandy soils with high water table. Partial to full sun. Younger trees are columnar and become more pyramidal over time. Useful as hedges, screens, windbreaks. Can reach heights of 30 to 50 feet and widths of 10 to 15 feet. **25 seedling per bundle.**

Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*): 1 year old. 6"-16". Large, fast-growing tree for lawns and open areas. Grows 60 to 75 feet in height with a spread of 40 to 50 feet. Dark green foliage varies between russet-red and bright red in autumn. Produces acorns attracting birds and wildlife. Prefers well-drained sandy loam soils. **10 seedlings per bundle.**

Red-osier Dogwood (*Cornus sericea*): 2 years old. 6"-16". A freely spreading shrub with numerous stems, 3 to 18 feet tall. The small flowers are white to greenish and are dense flat-topped clusters. Fruits are white and berry-like. It is adapted to wet and dry conditions and various soil types. Red stems provide winter interest. Shade tolerant. **10 seedlings per bundle.**

River Birch (*Betula nigra*): 2 years old. 10"-20". Open pyramidal, fast growth up to 90 feet. Thin reddish brown to black bark peels in the winter. Excellent tree for low, swampy areas. Full sun to partial shade. Immune to birch borer. **10 seedlings per bundle.**

Red Bud (*Cercis canadensis*): 1 year old. 5"-10" Lawn tree. Growth: 20'-30' high/ 25'-35' wide. Leaves: wide, heart-shaped bright green tinged red. Mature to a dark green. Flowers: small, purplish-pink pea-like. Fruit: flattened legume pods 2"-3" long. Medium growth. Bark: on stems is reddish-brown to dark brown. Somewhat ornamentally appealing. Full sun to light shade with moist, well-drained soil. Can adapt to most soils that are not permanently wet. Avoid very dry, hot locations. **10 seedlings per bundle.**

Black Cherry (*Prunus serotina*): 1 year old. 8"-18". One of the largest cherry trees. Valuable for lumber, cherries often used for jelly. Good for wildlife habitat. Flowers white in May-June, fruits June-October. **10 seedlings per bundle.**

American Cranberry Bush (*Viburnum trilobum*): 3 years old. 15"-32". Use for screening up to 10 to 12 feet, width of 8 feet. Dense growth of up to 3 feet per year in full sun or part shade. Has showy white flowers in spring and red berries in fall/winter. Berries make excellent bird feed. Very few insect problems. Prefers good, well-drained soil. For best growth, water during drought periods. For a solid screen, plant bushes 2 to 3 feet apart. **10 seedlings per bundle.**

Blueberries (*Vaccinium corymbosum*) Bluejay and Bluecrop: 2-3 years old. 12"-18". Space plants 6 to 8 feet apart, in rows spaced 8 to 10 feet apart. These upright shrubs will grow to a height of 4 feet. **IMPORTANT NOTE:** For blueberries, fruit set and crop size are improved by cross pollination. Plant both Bluejay and Bluecrop for best results. Bare Root seedlings. **Plants are sold individually.**

NE Annual & Perennial Wildflower Mix: A beautiful mix that may provide up to 5 years of color and attracts many varieties of birds and butterflies. Some of the seeds contained in this mix are: Bachelor's Button, Shasta Daisy, Black-Eyed Susan and Purple Coneflower. 1 oz. bags will cover approximately 125 sq. ft. **23 varieties in 1 oz. bags.**

Showy NE Native Wildflower Mix with Grasses: A perennial mix that will provide color, texture and will attract a variety of wildlife. Some seeds in this mix are: Big Bluestem, Early Goldenrod, Grey and Early Goldenrod, Wild Blue Lupine, Black-Eyed Susan and Indiangrass. 1 oz. bags will cover approximately 125 sq. ft. **23 varieties in 1 oz. bags.**
